

Bolton Hill Tree Sale

CHRISTMAS activities of the Bolton Hill Garden Club will begin Saturday with a sale of trees and fresh greens in the parish house of Memorial Episcopal Church, West Lafayette avenue at Bolton street.

The doors will open at 9 A.M., with Mrs. Francis X. Whittie and Mrs. Edward L. Gray in charge, and will remain open until everything is sold. Club members will assist at the sale, which includes fir trees of various heights, wreaths of pine and hemlock, garlands of laurel and cedar and holly sprigs.

Decoration of lamp posts will be handled by a committee of three—Mrs. Joseph A. Mooney, Jr., Mrs. Walter W. Pearthree and Mrs. Richard N. Stein, who will hang wicker bells, big red bows and evergreens at the various intersections of Bolton street, Park avenue and John street with Lafayette avenue, Lanvale and Mosher streets.

Climaxing the season's activities will be the Christmas doorway contest, held annually on the afternoon of the day after Christmas, when the best wreaths and swags, the most original design, the most modern, the best twin effect and over-all house decor will be awarded ribbons. A cup will be given for the outstanding entry.

An invitation class will be open to blue ribbon winners of last year, and there will also be a class for children, to be designated by a gold star in the window.
